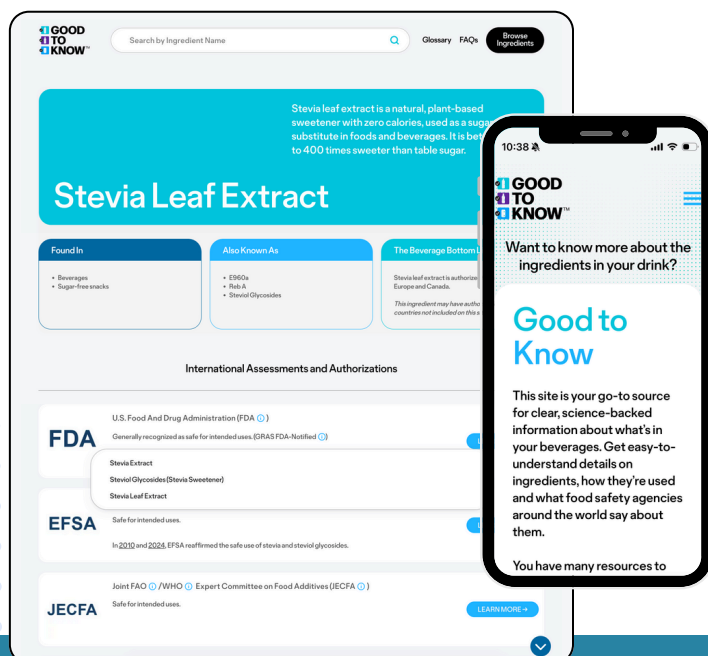
Delivering Straightforward Information

It also identifies for the first time which ingredients have a Generally Recognized as Safe (GRAS) Self-Determined authorization.
